Around 1 in 14 US net users has created a blog, and more than a quarter read others' blogs. Eleven million claimed to have consulted a blog during the election campaign. Despite this, nearly two-thirds of web users are still unsure what a blog is" (*NewScientist*, 8 Jan. 2005). Blogs have become so popular that the governments of China and Iran monitor and crack down on individual journals.
