cs	<i>comma splice</i> a comma is placed between two complete sentences	run-on	<i>indicates a run-on sentence</i>
diction	<i>wrong or improper word use</i>	sp	<i>spelling</i> the word is misspelled
font	font type or size is incorrect	sv agr	<i>subject-verb agreement</i> the subject and verb do not agree
frag	<i>fragment</i> indicates a fragment (incomplete sentence)	trans	<i>transition needed or missing</i>
inden	<i>check indentation</i>	ts/TS/top	<i>topic sentence</i>
^ or v	<i>insert</i>
